More Listening and Sharing

The week before us posed many challenges and was filled with many voices from our work in diverse areas, all of which are important to the congregation.

CIS

July 20 began with the presentation of the journey made by CIS from 2018 onward. Sr Eli-

sabeth Müller and Rani Padayattil shared what they have done together with other sisters who have served in the CIS: Sr Barbara Perali, Sr Toni Longo and Sr Patrizia Pasquini. They listed pilgrimages to Vallecorsa and Acuto, seminars, Spiritual retreats, meetings for ASC Formators, a Spirituality Seminar in Tanzania; seminar for temporary professed close to perpetual vows and for sisters in midlife, initial and ongoing formation meetings.



At the study level, CIS tried to offer concrete help by offering material to nurture communities, to update our documents, to update the Profiles Series, with the biography of Sr. Catherine Girrens. More Giovanni Merlini Merlini studies were published, three issues of the new Hope-Speranza series, and the spiritual exercises preached last September to ASC, CPPS and P.S. Missionary Sisters leadership.

JPIC / VIVAT

Another topic we hold dear is that of Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation. Participation in the NGO VIVAT is a way of collaborating with this goal, in partnership with other religious congregations, to give voice to those who would not otherwise be heard at the tables of power in our world.

FUND OF THE CONGREGATION Maria de Mattias Heart and Hands

Sr Monica Rini, General Treasurerand Sr Vicki Bergkamp, U.S. Regional Superior, presented the Congregational Fund report. The fund was established 25 years ago, when we "put our assets in common," and to date it has been able to support projects worth far more than the fund's initial deposit. In this way, it is still a great gift today as an instrument of love and generosity to so many realities in need.

ECONOMIC DIRECTORY



On the 21st General Treasurer, Sr. Monica Rini, presented the Economic Directory. This is a Fourth Book that completes the normative texts of our Proper Law. Significant in this text, the inclusion of an initial understanding that expresses the charismatic dimension in reference to "Evangelical management of goods in the service of the Mission." This directory will still need to be revised and deepened.

RATIO FOR FORMATION

Sr Wiesława Przybyło, general councilor, presented a first draft of the third normative text at the Congregation level, the Ratio Formationis, where the foundations of our ASC style of Formation are presented. Sr Wiesława shared some of the difficulties encountered in drafting the text, mainly due to the withdra-



wal of some members of the Commission for various justified reasons.



In drafting the document, we were aware of how complex the reality of youth is today and how serious is the challenge of seeking an updated Formation adequate for the new generations. A challenge for all of us, who desire the growth of our Charismatic Family, begun by our dear Foundress.

It is precisely she, St. Maria De Mattias, who sustains us and makes us feel the joy of being together as sisters from different parts of the world, to seek new ways that give relavant and truthful answers, to the youth of today.

Pilgrimage of Thanksgiving to the Eucharistic Shrine of Lanciano

On July 23 we joyfully traveled to Lanciano, where in the 8th century what is considered one of the first Eucharistic miracles took place.

The bus ride to Lanciano, lasted about three hours and was filled with community and individual prayer which prepared our hearts for the encounter with the mystery of the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Lanciano welcomed us with an atmosphere of peace, quiet streets and bright sunshine. The church, which holds the great mystery, captivated us with its simplicity.

The Eucharistic miracle occurred when a priest, who was experiencing a crisis of faith, doubted Christ's presence in the Eucharist. He prayed that "the Lord would remove from his heart this wound of unbelief." This account helps us deal with doubts and difficulties of faith. The priest's request to God for help was answered. During the consecration, the host turned into a fraction of heart muscle and the wine into blood.

With this extraordinary action, Christ shows us that despite our weaknesses, failings and doubts, He continues to come to us. The Eucharistic miracle of Lanciano is God's response to the cry of a people longing for more faith. It is a gift that grows along with the need of the human heart. At Lanciano, Jesus Christ responded to this need of the heart.

Scientific research in the 20th century has shown that the fragment of the Host that became flesh is a fragment of the dying heart of a man who is experiencing immense suffering.

What touched us in this study was the discovery that this heart is still alive. Both the heart muscle fragment and the blood are of blood type AB, as is the case in other Eucharistic miracles.

We were moved by the fact that Jesus makes himself close to us, hidden in the mystery of the Eucharistic miracle. When we approached the ciborium-it was only a brief moment-we felt that it was not us, but Jesus, who first touched us with his Love.

Our hearts were kindled with a love that did not come from us. This is the greatest gift we have received.

Although the miracle of Lanciano is a great sign, let us not forget that every time we participate in the Eucharist, we witness the same miracle. Just as Jesus allowed Thomas to touch his wounds, so today Jesus, in the mystery of bread and wine, allows himself to be touched in his Body and Blood.




We thank the Lord for the work done by the Congregational Fund Committee for supporting the needs of ASC mission and formation.

Today started with a free morning. We were all grateful. There were outings, time for prayer, laundry and for some, other meetings.




